

The Center is one of few providers in Central Iowa who offer mental health services to children, teens and adults from all walks of life including those who are uninsured, underinsured, or from low-income households.

For 50 years the Center has provided transformative services that integrate mind, body, and spirit. The Center serves annually more than 2,500 children, teens and adults through a multidisciplinary team of 30 licensed clinicians holding masters or doctorate level degrees. Clinical and holistic services include:

- Individual, couples, and family counseling
- Psychological testing and assessment
- Psychiatry
- C.O.O.L. (Children Overcoming Obstacles of Life), a specialized program for children and adolescents
- Training for clinical professionals
- Spiritual direction
- PrairieFire, a two-year renewal program
- Clergy and congregational development opportunities
